First church meeting after organization was at John Brown's house on March 6, 1816. The church was received into the Madison Association in 1816 at the close the first year with church numbered 48 - and second year 84.

Church dismissed from Madison Association and added to Cortland on Jan. 9, 1827 - 1828 Masonry trouble. (Page 13, 14)

Records of Baptist Church in Tully.

Proceedings of Council at it's organization Feb. 28, 1816.

A Council of Ministries and Delegates from the following churches, viz. Pompey, Fabius, Homer & Truxton convened at the house of Urial Smith in the town of Tully on the 28th day of February A.D. 1816 at the request of a number of brothers and sisters united in Covenant relation to examine into their standing and to deliberate on the expediency of giving them fellowship as a Gospel Church.

From Homer: Elder Alfred Bennett, Dea. Thomas Collar, Br. Salisbury, Br. Elisha Green .

From Pompey & Fabius: Dea. White Osborn, Dea. Caloin Peck, Br. Russell Chase.

From Truxton: Elder Thomas Purrinton, Elder Rufus Freeman, Br. Urial Smith, Br. John Boutwell.

Chose Elder Alfred Bennett Moderator & Br. Russell Chase Clerk. Prayer by Elder Rufus Freeman. After examining their travel as a Conference their numbers & gifts, their Articles of Faith, Doctrine and Practice and prayerfully deliberating on the same, the Council agreed to give the following Brethren & Sisters fellowship as a Gospel Church. Viz.

The following Articles of Faith and Practice were adopted as the platform of this church as its first Constitution.

ARTICLE FIRST

We believe that there is but one God who is denominated in the Scriptures the Father, Son and Holy Ghost, that these three are the only living and true God, the author of all created beings and things.

Math. 28: 19; 1 John. 1: 7; Rev. 4: 11.

ARTICLE SECOND

We believe the Scriptures of the Old and New Testaments were given by the inspiration of God and that they are an unerring rule of Faith and Practice for all mankind. 2nd Tim. 3: 16, 17. 2nd Peter 1:21.2

ARTICLE THREE

We believe that God made man upright, that he has fallen and become sinful, that all his posterity is wholly depraved and inclined to evil, and that the just demerit of sin is eternal punishment, and that the only way of salvation from sin and misery is by the sovereign Grace of God through the atonement of Jesus Christ. Gen. 1: 27th verse, Rom. 9:10 to 18, 2nd Thess. 1:9, Ephe.2:8, Acts 4:12, Rom. 5:11.

ARTICLE FOURTH

We believe in the final perseverance of the Saints. Romans 8:28 to 39, John 10:27 to 29.

ARTICLE FIFTH

We believe the Son of God will come to judge the world in Righteousness. That there will be a resurrection of the dead both of the just and unjust; and that the punishment of the wicked and the happiness of the righteous will be Eternal. Acts 17:31 & 24:15; Matt. 25:46.

ARTICLE SIXTH

We believe that baptism by immersion is the only scriptural mode; and that believers professing faith in Christ are the only proper subjects for baptism. Romans 6:4, Coll. 2:12, Eph. 4:5, Mark 16:16, Acts 8:37, Matt. 3:7,8.

ARTICLE SEVENTH

We believe that the Lords Supper is an institution of Christ designed for his church and that none ought to be admitted to it but such as have been baptized upon a profession of their faith and have united with a Gospel Church. Matt. 26:26 thru 30, Cor. 11:23 to end, Cor. 10:17, Acts 2:41 & 42.

ARTICLE EIGHTH

We believe the first day of the week is by way of eminence styled the Lord's Day and the whole day ought to be devoted to the public and private duties of religion, by assembling ourselves for public worship and attending to divine things at home, and to abstain from all unnecessary labor or recreation. Rev. 1:10, Acts 20:7, John 20:19, Heb. 10:25.

ARTICLE NINTH

We believe both secret and family prayer is a duty, those who are heads of families ought daily to have the scriptures read in the hearing of those under their care; and to talk to them of Devine things; to pray with them morning and evening and to teach their children and those under their care the true principles of virtue and holiness and to restrain them from all vicious courses as much as in their lies. Matt. 6:6, Joshua 24:13, Jer.10:25 thru 1st Tim. 5th 4th & 3rd , Titus 3:8, John 5:39, Eph. 6:4.

ARTICLE TENTH

We believe it to be the duty of believers in Christ who have been baptized upon profession of their faith to embody as a church to maintain the worship of God and His ordinances and that there be a council sent for from sister churches to examine as to their faith, doctrine and practice and to give them fellowship as a sister church. Acts 2:47, 7 11:26 _____.

ARTICLE ELEVENTH

We believe that God has appointed officers in his church such as Elders or Bishops and Deacons who ought to be set apart by ordination. Phil. 1:1, Titus 3rd chapt., Acts 6:to the 6th.

ARTICLE TWELFTH

We believe the church has the right to choose their own officers and to discipline their own members in conformity to the Word of God, having Christ for its Head and representation, and that they have a right to call a council in difficult cases. Public offences ought to be publicly confessed. Church members are forbidden to sue each other in ordinary cases . First Cor. 6th Chapter.

ARTICLE THIRTEENTH

We believe that the leading steps of duty for labor and discipline are set forth in the thirteenth chapter of Matthew.

ARTICLE FOURTEENTH

We believe that ministers ought to give themselves to the work of the ministry to study and teaching.

church, and other members possessing gifts ought to improve them in subjection to the judgment of their brethren. Matt. 28:19,20, Acts 6:2 thru 6, Acts 20:20.

ARTICLE FIFTEENTH

We believe it to be the duty of church members to watch over each other in love and so fulfill the law of Christ. Gal. 6:1&2,

ARTICLE SIXTEENTH

Every church for the support of the Gospel Ministry and other necessary charges among them ought to communicate of their substances according to the ability of each that there may be an equality and the church has a right to judge of the ability of each member and ought to deal with those as covetous who neglect their duty. 1st Cor. 9:6 to 14, 1st Tim. 5:18, 2nd Cor. 8:13 to 15.

ARTICLE SEVENTEENTH

It is our duty to give alms, especially to help the needy members of the church yet not excluding application to the provision made by law for the relief of the poor. Acts 11:29, Deo. 24:17, Rom. 12:13, Cor. 8:4.

ARTICLE EIGHTEENTH

We believe Christ has instituted water baptism and the Lord's Supper to be observed by his followers to the end of the world and they ought to be administered by those only who are in good standing and have themselves been buried in baptism and regularly set apart to the work of the ministry. 1st Cor. 11:24&25&26, Matt. 28:19&20.

COVENANT

We do now in the presence of God, Angels and men, without the least known reserve devote ourselves to God choosing the Father, Son and Holy Ghost to be our God and Portion for time and eternity. Promising most solemnly to make His word the rule of our Faith and Practice.

The Covenant to take heed to ourselves to our temper, conversation & company: Not to indulge passionate revengeful anger but to maintain a peaceful quiet deportment at home and abroad: Not to allow ourselves in lascivious talking: Foolish jesting, evil speaking or _____ haunting: but to have our conversation & company as becometh the Gospel of Christ.

The promise to keep a faithful watch over each other: to provoke one another to love and good works: to be tender of the personal estate & character of all who are united with us: to be just in all our dealings both among ourselves and towards all men and to do good to all men as we have opportunity especially to the household of faith.

We covenant religiously to observe the Lord's Day, not to allow ourselves in unnecessary worldly business or conversation but constantly to devote the first day of the week to the public and private duties of religion, not forsaking the assembling of ourselves together as the manner of some is.

We promise to practice secret prayer and when or while we are heads of families we covenant to maintain the worship of God morning and evening in our houses: daily to attend to the scriptures for the instruction of our families: and to use our earnest endeavors to bring up those under our care in the nurture and admonition of the Lord.

We covenant to attend to the appointments of the church to be at meeting in good season: Statedly to unite with our brethren in observing the Communion Supper and all the ordinances of Christ's house: To maintain Gospel disciplines: To seek the prosperity of this particular church and the good of the Redeemers Kingdom in general. And should we ever be removed to any other place so that we cannot enjoy the ordinances of Christ in this particular church we will endeavor so soon as we have opportunity to unite with some other church of the same faith and order. And we solemnly covenant in whatsoever part of the world we may live to devote ourselves to God and to seek the prosperity of Zion so far as our abilities and opportunities permit to the end of our days.

Looking unto God for assistance we severally and unitedly make this solemn covenant.

2:00 p m at which Br. Aaron Vail was chosen Clerk and Liba Palmer Deacon. It was also resolved to observe the ordinance of the Lord's Supper on the second Sabbath in each alternate month and that a covenant meeting preparatory to communion be held the Saturday previous. And also that on the second Saturday in each intermediate month the church hold a conference.

At a church conference held on the 13th day of April it was resolved that the right hand of fellowship be given in all cases to members when received into the church. During this year the church was destitute of the administration of the word: but were favored with the occasional labors of Elders Haman, Alfred Bennett, Rufus Freeman, Jonathan Ferris, P.P. Roots, _____ Corkins & Frederick Freeman.

Church received as a member of the Madison Baptist Association at its session in Cazenovia on the 11th day of Sept. 1816: messengers, Uriel Smith & Aaron Vail. No of members 20.

The church traveled in unison during the first year of its existence and continued to receive accessions to her members so that at the close of the first year from its organization her numbers amounted to 48.

1817

The church during the year 1817 continued to increase rapidly in numbers although destitute of a pastor. Towards the latter part of the year the church voted to hold their meetings for public worship on the Lord's Day in rotation at the three following places viz. At the School House in Christian Hollow, at the School House near the village on Tully Flats & at the School House near the village now called Vesper.

Mar. 19, 1817

The church appointed Jonathan Irish to serve as a Deacon.

Dec. 6, 1817

Chose Clark Irish, Clerk in place of Aaron Vail. Some labors became necessary during the year with individuals for disorderly walk but unison and peace abounded in the church as a body. The church sent as delegates to represent them in the Association: Uriel Smith & Harrison Church.

Received by baptism during the associational year 43: by letter 8: excluded 1: dismissed 2: died: Whole number returned - 70.

1818

During the year 1818 the church enjoyed the pastoral labors of Elder Squire Abbott - Continuing to hold their meetings for public worship at their three different places the same as the year past. Little worth of record seems to have transpired: The church continuing in a peaceful and united state.

The church sent as messengers to the Association: Elder Squire Abbott, Uriel Smith & Harrison Church. Received by baptism during the Associational year - 10, By letter - 5, Died - 4, Excluded (Dismissed) - 4, No. returned - 11, Received by baptism between the 28th Feb. 1818 & 28th of ___ 1819, Fanny Clements - 1, By letter - none.

1819

Elder Squire Abbott continued in the pastoral charge for this year. Few additions to the church during this year. Several labors with members for disorderly walk. Church continued to meet in the same manner as in the preceding year. Uriel Smith, Harrison Church & Henry J. Hall delegates to Association.

NOTE

Owing to the confused and defective state of the records from the year 1818 to the year 1824 that it is impossible to assign the names of members who united with the church or the date of their union. From a note however it appears that the numbers reported to the Association was 108.

1820

The church this year has pastoral labor occasionally from Elder Salmon Morton a note similar to the above states that the church returned 108 members to the Association this year.

1821

Church supplied with pastoral labor a part of the time during the early part of the year by Elder Morton. There appears little worthy of record in the transactions of the church during this year. Number of members returned to the association not stated.

1822

Very few of the transactions of this year are noted. It appears however that the church was destitute of a pastor for the most part of the time during the year.

1823

The year 1823 was characterized by nothing remarkable in the history of the church. There appears to have been few additions either by baptism or letter. The church still remained without a pastor, having occasional ministrations of the Word, and enduring some trials from the disorderly walk of several individual members

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Aug. 16, 1823

The church made choice of Uriel Smith as Clerk of the church in place of Clark Irish who had officiated as Clerk since Dec. 1817. The delegates to the Association this year were: Deacons; John Haynes & Uriel Smith & Br. Aaron Vail.

1826

The church continued in union and enjoyed the ministry of Elder Frederic Freeman. The church still continued to hold their meetings in different sections of the town. At the annual meeting the church made choice of Uriel Smith as Clerk for the year. Church made choice of Elder Frederic Freeman. John Haynes, Uriel Smith, Samuel Emmons, Samuel Stone, Davis White & Liba Palmer as delegates to the Madison Association. The additions by baptism or letter were few during the year.

1825

At the annual meeting held on the 11th day of Jan. the church voted to continue Br. Uriel Smith as Clerk, Elder Frederic Freeman still continued in the Pastoral charge of the church and his labors were greatly blessed. The church continuing in peace enjoying a copious outpouring of the Divine Spirit and receiving large accessions to her numbers. A large and commodious Meeting House located in the territorial center of the church had been erected by the Baptist Religious Society connected with the church and appropriating to their use, the house being solemnly dedicated to the service of God on the 11th day of Feb. 1825. The church continued to receive frequent accessions to her members during the year.

Delegates to the Association for the year 1825 were: Elder Frederic Freeman, Deacons, Uriel Smith & John Haynes, Br. Josiah Daniels & Benjamin Stokers.

At the annual meeting held at the meeting house on the 10th of Jan. the church elected Josiah Daniels Clerk for the ensuing year in place of U. Smith, former Clerk.

Nothing important in church polity transpired during the year. The church was represented in Association by Elder Frederic Freeman, Dea. Uriel Smith & Samuel Stone.

On the 30th Dec. church voted that they would appoint delegates to meet delegates from other churches in council at Homer on the 3rd Wednesday in June 1827 to confer on the propriety of forming a new Association. Appointed Elder F. Freeman, Uriel Smith and Samuel Stone.

1827

At the annual church meeting held at the meeting house on the 9th of January, Dea. Uriel Smith was

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chosen Moderator. Daniel Vail Clerk for the year. At a subsequent meeting U. Smith was chosen Treasurer for the church during the same.

The church continued in harmony and received occasional additions by baptism and letter during the year. During a part of this year the church were destitute of a stated ministrations of the word, but towards its close Elder Randolph Streeter became her Pastor.

Delegates to the Madison Association this year were Uriel Smith, Samuel Emmons, Josiah Daniels, Oren Whitcomb and David Vail who were instructed to request a dismission of the church from that Association

preparatory to her becoming a member of the Courtland Association then about to hold its first Session, which request was granted and the church was received as a member of the Courtland Association. The church returned to the Madison Association at Woodstock. 146 members.

At the annual meeting held at the meeting house on the 8th day of Jany. The officers of the preceding year were re-elected without exception. Elder Randolph Streeter, Pastor.

The church continued to enjoy peace measurably within her borders. Brother Randolph Streeter, Liba Palmer, John Shue, Uriel Smith, John Haynes, Josiah Daniels, Lebina Smith were delegates to the Cortland Association. During the year Free Masonry began to trouble the church in some respects.

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1829

The annual church meeting was held at the meeting house on the 6th day of January. Orin Whitcomb, Chair, Uriel Smith chosen Clerk for the year. A resolution was passed to choose four brethren to serve as Deacons. Whereupon John Haynes, Uriel Smith, Josiah Daniels and Daniel Vail were elected. Uriel Smith elected Treasurer for the year. Elder Randolph Streeter continued to be the Pastor of the church. The subject of Free Masonry which had agitated the church in common with other churches generally was disposed of by the passage of a resolution in substance as follows:

Resolved - That we cannot hold fellowship with any person who has united to and held fellowship with

the Masonic Institution and humbly confess their fault. Also subscribing a recantation embracing the substance of this resolution. Toward the close of this year a service of trials commenced which eventually caused a very serious and unhappy division. Elder R. Streeter, Samuel Stone, Daniel Vail and William I. Warner were delegates to the Association.

At the Eighteenth Annual Church Meeting held at the meeting house on Tuesday the 6th day of January, David Kelsey was chosen Chairman & Supply Chase elected Clerk for the year. Rec'd. and accepted the Treasurers report for the year preceding, find in his hands an unexpended balance for the expense of table. \$00.49

Do for contingent expenses 1.27

Made choice of Uriel Smith as Treasurer for the year. Chose Josiah Daniels Auditor for the same time. Resolved that all committees appointed by the church make their reports in writing. Church appointed Daniel Vail to take the general superintendence of the Meeting House and required the Treasurer to disburse money upon his order. And the same also with regard to orders drawn by the Deacons.

Made choice of Josiah Daniels & John Haynes as Deacons. On the first day of February 1834, Elder Reuben Winchell continued as Pastor of the church during the year.

A protracted meeting commenced on the seventh day of April and continued nine days successively during which many were hopefully converted and the church received large additions.

The church enjoyed union and peace together with a large measure of prosperity.

An embarrassing debt for building the Meeting House which had for a long time lain with oppression wrought upon the church and society was this year cancelled by the liberating of several individuals thus removing a heavy burden. On this occasion the church passed a vote of thanks to the trustees of the Society who bore the responsibility of building the house, and also a separate vote of thanks to M. E. Pres.

Nicole Howell & Russell Chase, two of the trustees of the Society for their generous exertions in advancing the funds necessary for the payment of arrearages due for materials and labor in its erection.

On the first day of Feb. 1834 in consideration of the confusion and imperfect state of the earlier records of the church it was resolved that a new book be procured and a committee appointed to make a transcript of such parts and transactions of the church from its first organization as are of general interest in a historical point of view and submit it to the church for their approval.

In the month of August an application was presented to the church by a number of brethren and sisters living in the town of LaFayette and a few in the northern part of the town of Tully, for permission to form themselves into a Conference preparatory to being organized into a separate church which petition was granted by the church.

The preceding historical sketch of the transactions of the church from its first constitution of the 28th day of Feb. 1816 up to the close of the year 1834, embracing a period of about eighteen, has but made in many respects from the want of order and confused state of the records in the earlier transactions of the church, it is believed to embody all of general interest to succeeding generations with the exception perhaps, of some six or seven of the earlier years.

In taking a retrospective view of the past there is much to humble and abase and also abundant cause for gratitude and thankfulness to the great Head of the church. On the one hand we remember the many who have fallen through temptation who once promised to become blessings to this branch of the militant church, and to exert a happy and benign influence on all around them. We remember also how oft the Savior has been wounded in the house of His friends in consequence of the many trials, troubles, and divisions which have from time to time marred the peace of Lion and caused tears of grief for her affliction. Surely when we behold the working of fallen and depraved nature as exhibited in these things, we have much cause for self abasement and humility. On the other hand when we contemplate the goodness of our Heavenly Father, his long suffering and boundless mercy displayed in the numberless blessings bestowed in reviving the spirits of His children. In the conversion of the impenitent and the great and rapid increase of this church growing as it were beneath His smiles from a feeble band of fourteen like sheep in a wilderness without a shepherd, in life than eighteen years to more than two hundred resident members surrounded with

every privilege, we surely have abundant reason for giving praise and adoration to God for His goodness.

The undersigned committee appointed under the resolution of Feb. 1st, 1834 having therefore completed the duties assigned them by the above resolution submit the foregoing sketch as the result of their labors. Resolved that we cordially approve of the formation of the American Foreign Bible Society by the convention held in the city of New York on the 12th of May 1836, that the unadulterated Word may be sent over the whole world and the most faithful translation of the original text be made in the several different languages wherever the Missionaries of the Cross shall come. Resolved that we organize ourselves into a Bible Society Auxiliary to the American Foreign Bible Society. Resolved that we make all

possible effort by our prayers and contributions to sustain the Parent Society.

Dec. 31, 1836

1837

Jan. 3, 1837

Looking back upon the past year, we find abundant reasons why we should be grateful and encouraged to press forward. In view of the long suffering and goodness of God in keeping us in union and peace among ourselves and with those about us & in bringing sinners to bow their wills to God, and sufficient cause for repentance and humility that we have been no more engaged in our Masters service. During the year 14 have been baptized, 12 added by letter, 27 have been dismissed, 1 has been excluded and 1 died, leaving the present number 184.

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Feb. 18, 1837

Covenant meeting. Rec'd. as candidates for baptism, Joel Hiscock, John Peters, Fanny Hutchins, Hiram F. Warner, Peter Bennett, Davis Strail, Lucius King.

Mar. 4, 1837

Full attendance. Covenant meeting.

Mar. 25, 1837

Church meeting. Received as candidates for baptism, Sylvester Carter & Laura Bugbee.

Mar. 26, 1837

Sabbath intermission. Rec'd. as candidate for baptism Elizabeth Kneeland.

Apr. 22, 1837

Covenant meeting. Rec'd. as candidates for baptism Parson King, Alvah Wadsworth, Daniel Crofoot, Ira Green, Caleb Green, James Smith, Luvilla Smith & rec'd. Alvah Wiard who was previously baptized. Voted letters of dismissal to Eld. P. B. Everts & wife, Elizabeth Kneeland and Sally Brewer.

Jun. 5, 1837

Covenant meeting. Received as candidate for baptism Emily Smith. Voted to withdraw the hand of fellowship from Br. John Brown for leaving us & joining the Methodist connection. Appointed a

committee to visit Br. Allen Palmer, and U. Smith, P. Daniels, D. Vail be that committee. Appointed a committee to examine the records and look up the names of those who are absent & those that meet not with us. Committee to be U. Smith, D. Vail & E. V. P. French.

Jun. 8, 1837

Church meeting which was appointed on the 4th inst. Met & organized by appointing Brother John Brown Moderator. Meeting opened by prayer. Voted to hear from the committee appointed to hire a minister. Report that Elder Pease can be hired for \$350 per year or for \$300 & church be at the expense of moving him here. Expense not to exceed \$50. Report accepted. Voted to invite Br. P. Meeker to act with us in our deliberations this afternoon. Resolved that the committee appointed to visit Br. A. Palmer report. Report that they had visited him and agreed to meet the brethren here today & is here, find him by his own acknowledgement guilty of departing from the rules of Christ by communing with the Christians so called. Was tender and confessed he had broken his covenant with his brethren to their grief, was sorry and would do so no more and voted to forgive him.

Resolved that whereas it has been made known to the church this day that a certain person (a member of the order called Christians) did at our last communion, take a seat with us unknown to us as such, therefore resolved that we dis-fellowship the act and if there are any member or members of our church prior to it we dis-fellowship the act in them and hereby enjoin it upon them to make a confession of the same.

Jul. 1, 1837

Covenant meeting. Union and love abounding. Received as candidate for Baptism _____ Carr. After having expressed our views, those of us that were present respecting brother D. P. Smith's call to the ministry, personally then voted that we proceed to call Brother D. P. Smith to ordination.

Resolved that we invite the following churches to sit in council Viz. Scott, Homer, Cortland, Truxton, Fabius and Onondaga & LaFayette. And also invite Elder P. B. Everts to meet on the 11th at 10 o'clock A.M.

Voted that D. Vail, P. Daniels and E. V. P. French be a committee to bring the subject before the council. Committee of arrangements, P. Carter, K. Potter, Oliver Adams, Myron Miles and John Peters.

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Jul. 2, 1837

Voted to write to the Baptist Church at Marcellus and at Pompey Center & invite them also to sit in council.

Jul. 11, 1837

Pursuant to a resolution of the 1st of July a council convened at the Baptist Meeting house in Tully, for the purpose of examining D.P. Smith as a candidate for the Gospel Ministry and to set him apart (if thought proper by solemn ordination). Delegates duly appointed by their respective churches from the following: Scott, Homer, Courtlandville, LaFayette, Truxton, Fabius, 2nd Onondaga, Marcellus and Pompey Center.

Council organized by appointing Elder Alfred Bennett agent for foreign missions, Moderator. Elder G. W. Taggart, Clerk. On motion that D. Nickerson of Marcellus be requested to take a seat with the council. A motion was then made that the committee appointed by the church be considered entitled to vote in the council. After some desultory remarks the motion was lost, after which the committee of the church presented to the council the candidate who proceeded to give a relation of his Christian experience. Called to the Gospel Ministry and future field of labor his views of Gospel doctrine & church government. On motion resolved that the council retire for consultation. Prayer by Eld. L. Gardner. After mature deliberation on motion, resolved that we are satisfied with the religious expression of doctrine of the candidate that we proceed to ordination and that the following be the order of the exercise. 1st. Br. J. L. Cole preach. 2nd T. Purrington pray and lay on hands with J. C. Holt & B. Capron. A Bennett give the charge. O. Montague give the hand of fellowship. G. Gardner make concluding prayer & T. Purrington pronounce benediction.

Sep. 2, 1837

Covenant meeting. Few present but female. Rec'd. as candidate for baptism, Alida Lansing. Voted

letters of dismission to Br. Lebine Smith, wife and daughter.

Sep. 3, 1837

Appointed delegates to represent the church in Tully to the Onondaga Association to be held with the Baptist Church in Elbridge. Viz. U. Smith, P. Carter, A. Wadsworth,, S.A. Smith & P. Strail.

Sep. 30, 1837

Covenant meeting. Few present. Eld. Pease present for the first. After his arrival we voted a letter of dismission to Sarah Tompkins.

Nov. 4, 1837

Covenant meeting. Well attended. Well united. Rec'd. as candidate for baptism, Roswell Carr.

Nov. 5, 1837

After communion: Resolved that the next covenant meeting that is before the next on communion, the names of all the church members be called and resolved that each member be requested to pay one shilling for the support of the table expenses for the table furniture & if not one shilling as much as they feel able to pay.

1838

Jan 1, 1838

Commenced the year with a public fast. Covenant meeting, good number present & good state of feeling. Voted David Cherry and his wife letters of dismission and commendation up to the time they left us some five or six years since.

At the close of the year it is proper to reflect upon the past & with gratitude mark the hand of God in graciously preserving harmony & good feeling among the members of this vine of the Lord in planting & of increasing the mutual & reciprocal attachment of its several branches one to another and of each towards all. Let us all pray and labor for the things that make for peace and the things whereby one may

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edify another. That God may yet continue to extend his protecting & bountiful hand over us and scatter the blessings of salvation in our midst and mercifully protect us & powerfully defend us from our enemies that assail us without and our foes that would torment us within. During the year 22 have been dismissed, 2 commended to other churches, 3 have died, 2 have been excluded & there has been added by baptism 22, and by letter 6, the present number is 185.

Jan 9. 1838

Twenty second annual church meeting. Prayer by Eld. Pease, after which Br. U. Smith was chosen Moderator and E. V. P. French elected Clerk for the ensuing year. Voted that we elect two Deacons for the present and defer from electing other until a subsequent time, then elect four and have them ordained. Elected Dea. Viz. P. Daniels and P. Out. Heard Treasurers report and accepted the same. In the treasury \$4.62 for contingent expenses. S. S. Carpenter Treasurer present year. D. Vail Auditor present year. Resolved: that S. S. Carpenter have the custody of the house and build fires during the year for three dollars.

Resolved: That the Treasurer pay money at the order of the Deacons. Heard report of Deacons. Viz. Due them for table expenses \$1.75. Report accepted and pay them out of the money collected by members (\$1 shill per member.)

Resolved: That we recommend to the members of this church to pay annually one shilling each for the table expenses, wine ok and for table furniture, charities, ok

Resolved: That the above money be committed to the hands of the Deacons with connexion with Br. U. Smith to be paid out for table furniture.

Resolved: That H. T. Tallman, P. Carter, P. Out, be a committee to have the care & charge of the parsonage property until it comes into the hands of Society by writing.

Adjourned to the first Tuesday in Jan. 1839, at 1 o'clock p m.

Jan. 20, 1838

At a special meeting of the Baptist church in Tully on the 20th day of Jan. 1838 _____ was chosen Moderator and H. T. Tallman Clerk pro tem.

Resolved: That the church and society make an effort to build horse sheds at the Meeting House.

Resolved: That a committee be appointed to investigate the subject by estimating the cost, manner of building. Ok and report thereon.

Resolved: That H. T. Tallman, P. Carter & P. Hiscock compose 2nd committee.

Resolved: That a committee be appointed to visit delinquent members. E. B. Goodrich, S. King, Wm. Sexton, Mr. Brinks son and daughter and Moses Pratt.

Resolved: That the Deacons and Br. U. Smith compose said committee.

Resolved: That this meeting be adjourned until the next monthly church meeting.

Mar. 3, 1838

May 5, 1838

Covenant meeting. Some few present & union among the few.

Resolved: That we grant Br. Lebina Smith a license to improve his gift in public speaking or preaching.

Heard from Br. D. Brown who desired to return and take up his abode again with us. Appointed a committee to confer with him viz. Eld. Pease, Br. D. Out & Br. Adams.

Jun. 2, 1838

Monthly conference. Lucretia A. Smith rec'd. as candidate for baptism. Some of the brethren & sisters revived & had something new to tell. Closed our meeting which commenced two weeks before. God proved himself faithful to his promise for all that did truly wait on him renewed their strength in every deed.

Jun. 10, 1838

Sabbath intermission. Chauncey Cole was rec'd. as candidate for baptism.

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Jun. 16, 1838

At a meeting for conference and prayer, Br. Samuel Smith was rec'd. as candidate for baptism, also P. R. Wightman and Samuel F. West.

Jul. 1, 1838

Covenant meeting. Love & union. Voted to restore to our fellowship Br. John Brown. Rec'd. as candidate for baptism, Br. & Sister Wates.

Aug. 4, 1838

Monthly conference. Voted that the old committee holding the subscription be authorized to settle with Eld. Pease & also to circulate a new subscription. Viz. Dea. F. Daniels, U. Smith, P. Out, D. Vail, G. P. Carter, Richard Peters.

Aug. 25, 1838

Met in special church meeting pursuant to public notice. Introductory prayer by Eld. Pease. Appointed G. R. Wightman Clerk pro tem.

Heard and approved the reports of the committees in regard to the several delinquent members whereupon:

Resolved: That we withdraw our fellowship from the following brethren & sisters for the following reasons: From Sidney Smith, Hannah Wakeman, for neglect of Christian duty & travel with the church. Henry Stevens for the same. From James Terry and Schuyler King for neglect of Christian duty and intemperance. From Wm. Sexton for neglect of duty and unsoundness in doctrine. From Moses Pratt & Margaret Prevost for neglect of duty & long absences from meeting. From Almira Palmer for unchristian conduct & neglect of duty. From Jane Sturdevant for uniting with another denomination.

NOTE; COPY REPORT

The following report should have been recorded before what is above. Your committee appointed June 3, 1837, to whom was assigned the duty of examining the records for the purpose of ascertaining the names

of those that have absented themselves & removed from us without taking letters and also of those who are absent from Communion & delinquent in their travel with us. By leave, report that we find of the first mentioned class the following names: Hannah Bonatts, Margaret Prevost, Almira Palmer, Jane Sturdevant, Henry Stephens, Phebe Morse, Lydia Kent, E. B. Goodrich & Moses Pratt. And of the second class: Huldah Christian, Elisa Fuller, Betsey Fuller, Alida Lansing, Polly Chapman, Anna Doren, Prudence Bonatts, Polly Hallenback, John Vail, Eunice Vail, Elisa Bennett, Almon Carr, Arathusa Carr, Esther Mason, Marenus J. Mason, Lynn Brink, Schuyler King, Sydney Smith & James Terry. And upon examination of the records we find a special committee appointed consisting of the Dea. & Br. U. Resolved: That we proceed to elect four persons to the office of Deacons, according to the Scriptures, and our Articles of Faith. Viz. as permanent officers of the church.

Resolved: That a committee be appointed to nominate suitable persons for said office and present them to the church and that said committee be Eld. Pease, Br. U. Smith, P. Daniels & David Williams.

Heard and accepted the treasurers report Viz. that there is \$3.30 in treasurers hands and all contingent expenses paid up to the present time. Elected S. S. Carpenter treasurer for the ensuing year.

Resolved: That the treasurer pay money at the order of the Deacons.

Resolved: That S. S. Carpenter have custody of the house and build the fires during the coming year.

Compensation for the same \$3.00.

Heard report of committee on nominations for Dea. and accepted same. They present as candidates for Deacon Br. U. Smith, P. Daniels as senior and John Out, E. V. P. French as junior deacons. Then proceed to the election of U. Smith, J. Daniels & Daniel Vail seniors, and J. Out, E. V. P. French as juniors. Then heard Dea. Report and find due to them five shillings & eleven pence.

Resolved: That it be paid from the money taken from church at 1 shilling per member as per standing resolution of last annual meeting. Elected H. T. Tallman to audit treasurers acct.

Resolved: That we adjourn until the first Tues. in Jan. A.D. 1840 at one o'clock P.M.

Feb. 2, 1839

Monthly conference, few present. Appointed a committee to visit the male members to stir them up to come out to special meeting viz. the Deacon & Br. U. Smith. Eld. Pease requested dismissal.

Feb. 16, 1839

Special church meeting. B. Vail was appointed Chairman. Prayer by Eld. Pease.

Resolved: That we raise the necessary means for the Gospel Ministry by Equality. Passed without a dissenting vote.

Resolved 2nd: That we raise \$300 for the object specified in the first resolution in the following manner. That each male member of the church who is 21 years old & upward pay \$1 and every female member 21 years and over \$.50, and every male member under 21 years of age pay \$.25, and the remainder to be equalized upon the property of the church. This equalization to be made by a committee hereafter appointed for this special purpose, and this committee to have power to exonerate any member from this resolution whom they think in their judgment unable to pay or from other circumstances improper that they should comply with the above.

Resolved 3rd: That this committee be composed of the following brethren; D. Vail, L. Henderson, P. Daniels & U. Smith.

Resolved 4th: That we grant Eld. Pease a dismission at the expiration of two thirds of his present pastoral year in compliance with his request.

Resolved 5th: That the Deacons be a committee whose duty it shall be to look out for another Pastor and to see that the pulpit is supplied. Meeting dismissed by prayer.

Mar. 2, 1839

Covenant meeting. Harmony and love abounding.

Mar. 16, 1839

A special church meeting convened & was opened by prayer after which Br. D. Brown was chosen Chairman.

Resolved: That Br. P. Daniels, J. Out, D. Vail, P. Carter, R. Peters & E. V. P. French be a committee to settle with Eld. Pease and to square up all arrearages.

Resolved: That Br. U. Smith be added to the committee whose duties are specified in the fifth resolution of the last special meeting, Feb. 16th.

Resolved: That Eld. Thomas Purrington be invited to become our Pastor if he shall be at liberty or is released from his charge in Truxton. Meeting closed by prayer.

Jun. 1, 1839

Monthly meeting. A good time. Heard and accepted the report of the committee who were appointed to hire a Minister. That they have agreed with Eld. G. Dill to become our Pastor upon the following condition viz. That they agree to pay him the sum of three hundred dollars per year and give him the use of the parsonage house and lot and also furnish his wood, delivered at the door and help him to obtain a cow when he arrives and export his goods from Syracuse free from expense. The money paid for a cow and what is paid him in advance to be taken from his salary.

Jul. 6, 1839

Covenant meeting. Good time.

Jul. 13, 1839

Conference. Love and union. Received by letter Eld. John S. Dill & Polly Dill & Sarah Dill.

Sabbath before association having received a request from the following members: viz. Sephronia Carter, Esther Chase, Rectina P. Chase, Elvia Blaney & Fedelia Hall that their names might be erased from the church records having united with another people known to us by the name of Campbellites. Thereupon resolved that their names be dropped from the records and they excluded from our fellowship.

Nov. 9, 1839

At a special church meeting voted that Br. U. Smith, John Out compose a committee to visit Ira Green, Chauncey Cole & Nancy Emmons. Also that Br. Vail & Dea. Daniels be a committee to visit Sister Bennett & the two Sisters Fuller.

1840

Jan. 7, 1840

Twenty fourth annual church meeting. Meeting opened. Elder Dill in the Chair, prayer by Dea. Daniels. Resolved: that the second vote of the last annual meeting be rescinded as far as relates to the permanency of the office of Deacon. On motion it was resolved that a committee of five be constituted to nominate suitable persons for Deacons & Clerk.

Resolved: that Josiah Daniels, Eld. Dill, Knight Potter, E. V. P. French & H. T. Tallman compose said committee.

The above committee reported as follows: H. T. Tallman for Clerk, who was elected for the ensuing year. Also that brethren Josiah Daniels, Urial Smith, John Out & E. V. P. French constitute the nominees for the office of Deacons who were unanimously elected for the ensuing year.

Heard the Treasurers report which was accepted, found remaining in his hands after the contingent expense were all paid, the sum of \$0.73.

Heard the Deacons report and find their due \$0.81 which was paid out of the funds for table expenses, which was accepted by vote of the meeting.

Resolved: That Br. S. L. Carpenter be Treasurer for the ensuing year. Also to have custody of house. Pay out money upon the orders of the Deacons & build the fires during the present year & have \$3.00 for his compensation.

Voted that the committee appointed to visit Ira Green, Chauncy Cole & Nancy Emmons be discharged as far as they have done their duty. Viz. in visiting C. Cole & I. Green.

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Resolved: That the church had labored sufficiently with Chauncy Cole & do therefore resolve that he the said Chauncy Cole by neglecting to walk with the Church & refusing to hear the call of the same is hereby disfellowshipped.

Resolved: That the church has labored sufficiently with Ira Green & do therefore resolve, that he the said Ira Green by neglecting to walk with the Church & refusing to hear the call of the same is hereby disfellowshipped.

Resolved: That Alyda Lansing for embracing Heretical sentiments is hereby excluded from Church fellowship.

Resolved: That Elizabeth B. Goodrich for neglect of duty is hereby excluded from Church fellowship.

Resolved: That Dea. Urial Smith be added to the committee appointed to visit Sister Bennett & the two Sisters Fuller.

Resolved: That a committee be appointed to visit Myron Niles, William Brink, Margaret Jones & Samantha Vail. Whereupon Brethren Daniel Vail & Sam. A. Smith were duly appointed as said committee.

Resolved: That a special Church meeting be held on Friday the 17th inst. at 1 o'clock P. M. at the meeting house.

Resolved: That the next annual church meeting be held on the first Tuesday in Jan. 1841 at 11 o'clock A.M.

Jan. 17, 1840

At a special meeting of the Church held agreeably to appointment Eld. Dill in the Chair. Prayer by Br. Out. It was resolved that the committee appointed to visit Myron Miles, Wm. Brink, Margaret Janes & Samantha Vail be empowered to visit Melissa Hough & Sally Carter & report at the next church meeting. Heard the report of the parsonage barn committee & accepted the same, and resolved that Brethren D. Vail, Richard Peters, Urial Smith & John Out settle & adjust the demands on the parsonage barn.

Feb. 1, 1840

Covenant meeting. An interesting time, a full attendance & a goodly number of Christians of Evangelical churches of other orders met with us. The Spirit of the Lord was manifestly with us. Many felt that they had been quickened & that the Lord had restored unto them the joys of his Salvation. Received by letter Caleb Hoag & Almira Hoag.

Feb. 23, 1940

Granted letters of dismission to Wm. Adams & wife & daughter.

Feb. 29, 1840

Covenant meeting. A good time. Received as candidates for baptism, Frances Peters, Susanne Strails, Esther Brown, Wm. Elliot, Catherine Elliot, Louisa Willard & Timothy Carr.

Mar. 1, 1840

Voted letters of commendation to Brother Carter & wife.

Mar. 6, 1840

At a special meeting Elder Dill in the Chair, Prayer by Dea. Daniels. Voted that the church have come to the end of their labor with Nancy Ann Emmons and also that she for embracing Campbell's & neglecting to do her duty as a member of this church is hereby disfellowshipped & further that the Clerk give her notice of the same. Voted that H. T. Tallman visit Sister Nancy Emmons & obtain her views & sentiments in regard to the faith & practice of the Baptist church.

Mar. 15, 1840

Voted letter of dismissal to Sister Electa Darling.

Mar. 22, 1840

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Voted letter of dismissal to Sister Emily Orvis, formerly Fritz.

Apr. 4, 1840

Monthly meeting. Few present, a good season, received Lyman Benjamin & Cyrus Kellogg as candidates for baptism.

Apr. 5, 1840

Voted Letters of commendation and dismissal to Sis. Catherine Strails and one of commendation to Br. Eliphalet Smith.

May 2, 1840

Covenant meeting, love & union abounding. Also a refreshing season. Received as candidates for baptism, Joseph Christian & his wife Margaret Christian & Elizabeth Straat. Received by letter Br. Jesse Carpenter & his wife Sist. Carpenter.

May 24, 1840

Monthly conference. Few present but the Spirit of the Lord with those that did come. Received candidates for baptism upon a relation of their Christian experience viz. Perry Henderson & Huldah Henderson, his wife. Artus B. Burroughs & Susan Burroughs his wife. Jacob Christian, Elizabeth Henderson & Phebe Cardner. Received by letter Sist. Polly Pratt. Letter of dismissal to Sister Adelia Smith.

Jun. 6, 1840

Covenant meeting. Union & love abounding. Few present. Voted a special church meeting to be held on the 18th.

Jun. 18, 1840

Held a special church meeting. Elder Dill in the Chair. Prayer by the Chairman. Heard the report of the committee on the case of Sisters: Betsey Fuller, Eliza Fuller & Sister Bennett. Accepted the same and discharged the committee.

Voted that sister Bennett retain her standing in the Church. Voted that we withdraw the hand of fellowship of Sister Betsey Fuller for embracing the doctrine of Campbell, denying the Deity of Christ, the omnipresence of God and believing in mixed communion at the Lord's Supper. Voted that we bear with patience Sister Eliza Fuller. Voted that the committee who obtained the services of Br. Dill be empowered to settle with him & be sustained in their acts by the church. Voted that Brethren C. Hoag, Martin Strail,

Peter Henderson, Cyrus Kellogg & David Williams compose a committee to secure the service of a Minister for the ensuing year & settle with him & adjust all accounts. Also to raise the Ministerial Support in the same manner as last year.

Covenant meeting. Few present. A good degree of love & fellowship manifest. Received by letter Br. Thomas G. Hayns (Haynes) & Sister Maria Hayns (Haynes) his wife. Voted that a committee composed of Brethren D. Vail & E. V. P. French be appointed to visit Br. M. P. Mason.

Sep. 5, 1840

Covenant meeting. A good degree of feeling manifest. Heard the report of committee appointed to visit Br. M. P. Mason & voted to discharge said committee. Appointed as delegates to the Association, Eld. P. S. Dill, Dea. U. Smith & Brethren Francisco Smith, Allen Palmer, Jesse Carpenter, David Vail, A. Wadsworth, E. Crofoot & H. T. Tallman.

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Sep. 20, 1840

Sabbath intermission. After some deliberations it was unanimously resolved that we call Br. Francisco Smith to Ordination.

Resolved: That a council be called to convene at the Baptist meeting house in Tully on Wednesday the 7th of Oct. next, composed of delegates from the following churches; Viz. Delphi, Fabius, Truxton, 2 Onondaga & LaFayette.

Oct. 3, 1840

Monthly conference, a time of union.

Resolved: That we appoint two brethren with our Pastor to sit in council with our brethren from sister churches.

Resolved: That Eld. P. S. Dill & brethren U. Smith, E. V. P. French, are duly appointed agreeably to the above resolution.

Resolved: That the following brethren compose a committee of arrangement. Viz. John Out, P. Christian.

Unanimously resolved to receive by letter, Sister Electa Darling.

Oct. 7, 1840

Pursuant to a resolution of the 20th Sept. a council convened at the Baptist meeting house in Tully for the purpose of examining Br. Francisco Smith as a candidate for the Gospel Ministry and to set him apart (if thought proper) by Solemn Ordination. Delegates appeared & took their seats duly appointed from the following churches. Viz. Fabius, Fabius & Truxton, LaFayette, Tully, 2nd Onondaga Council organized by appointing Eld. Thomas Purrinton, Moderator and Eld. Randolph Stanton, Clerk. On a motion resolved that the following brethren present, be invited to take a seat with the Council. Viz. Br. J. W. Pixley a licentiate, P. Finch, S. Fellows, R. Palmer, Z. Smith & M. Negus. After which the com. of the church introduced the candidate to the council who proceeded to give his views of Christian experience, call to the Gospel Ministry, Doctrines of the Bible & Church Government. On motion it was resolved the Council retire for consideration. After mature deliberation on motion resolved that the council are satisfied with the Christian experience, views of doctrine of the candidate and that the council proceed to ordination and that the following be the order of the exercises.

1st. Eld Purrinton preach the ordaining sermon.

2nd & 3rd Eld. Stanton offer ordaining prayer & lay on hands with Elders Purrinton & Dill.

4th Eld. Purrinton give the charge & Eld. Dill the right hand of fellowship. Closing prayer by Br. Pixley.

Hymns & Benediction by the candidate.

Oct. 24, 1840

Special church meeting. Met agreeable to appointment. Eld. Dill in the Chair. Prayer by Moderator. Heard the report of the committee of the parsonage, _____ & accepted the same. On motion resolved that the church sustain said committee in making advance payments on Eld. Dill salary, up to the 15th Dec. 1840.

Nov. 5, 1840

Covenant meeting. Dea. Smith, Br. A. Palmer & David Williams appointed to visit J. Strail Jr. Brethren S. A. Smith, E. V. P. French appointed to visit H. Brink.

1841

Jan. 5, 1841

Twenty fifth annual church meeting. Prayer by Br. J. Out, after which Br. Out was chosen Chairman until Eld. Dill should come in. Before any business was done Eld. Dill came & took the Chair. Then
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proceeded to elect E. V. P. French, Clerk for the ensuing year. Elected by the uplifted hand. Heard Deacons report & find in their hands \$4.15. Report was accepted.

Voted that Br. D. Vail act this day as Auditor of Treasurers account in absence of Br. Peterson. Heard & accepted Treasurer's report & find due the Treasurer \$0.57.

Resolved: That we elect four Deacons by joint ballot. Elected U. Smith, J. Daniels, J. Out & E. V. P. French. After some consultation, at his request, E. V. P. French was excused from serving as Deacon & then elected Br. Jesse Carpenter Deacon.

Resolved: To hear the reports of committees. 1st committee report by Br. U. Smith foreman. That they present Br. J. Strail Jr. who proceeded to acknowledge he had been out of the way, was sorry, hoped to be forgiven. Then further committee report that Br. Strail had been drunk several times & they have labored and labored. Voted to accept report & discharge committee. Voted that Br. S. be suspended from church fellowship & we bear with him until next monthly meeting. Next, committee to visit Br. Brink, report they have visited him. He acknowledged he had been guilty of drinking too much ardent spirits.

Resolved: That we accept report & discharge committee also that we suspend Br. Brink until we have further opportunity with him. Then heard committee on Br. J. Vail & Sister E. Vail and accepted the same & discharged said committee.

Resolved: That Br. Jesse Carpenter & Daniel Vail be a new committee to continue labors with Br. & Sister Vail. Report of comm. to visit Melissa Howe, now Melissa Coon. Received & committee discharged. Report favorable to S. Coon. Next heard from Br. S. A. Smith committee to visit Sister Samantha Vail. Br. Smith reports that he found Sister S. Vail troubled with close communion, said she had prayed over the subject & she had become satisfied that it was right for her thus to do. Viz. To commune with other denominations. Said she would keep her place with the church if the church would allow her that privilege, otherwise she would like to have the church give her a letter of dismissal & commendation to unite elsewhere. Tried (tired) with Baptist church because they are not willing to give letters for Br. & Sister to unite with other denominations.

Resolved: That we withdraw the hand of fellowship from sister Samantha Vail for 1st, neglect of walking with church for more than one year. 2nd, for communing with un-baptized Christians contrary to Bible doctrine & apostolic practice.

Resolved: That it be considered the duty of the church Clerk to notify those persons that are excluded from our fellowship. Br. Allen Palmer being received by the church as a substitute for Deacon Daniels, reports that he visited Sally Hiscock & found her troubled with close communion, wished to be discontinued here & retain her standing with the Methodists where she had previously united. Also visited Anna Hiscock. Troubled with close communion, believes in different modes of baptism & in falling from grace wished to be discontinued here & continue with the Methodists. Voted to accept the above report & discharge the committee.

Resolved: That we withdraw our fellowship from the above named sisters Viz. Sally & Anna Hiscock, they having left their parents and neglected to walk with their brethren with whom they had first covenanted and left them also for uniting with the Methodists.

Resolved: That Br. S. S. Carpenter be Treasurer for the ensuing year. Also to have custody of the

house, pay out money at the order of the Deacons & build the fires for the present year & have \$3.00 for his compensation.

Resolved: That Br. Daniel Vail be Auditor for the ensuing year.

Resolved: That the next annual church meeting be held in the Baptist Meeting House in Tully on the first Tuesday in Jan. 1842 at 10 o'clock A. M.

Jan. 11, 1841

Sabbath. At the close of the afternoon service it was moved by Br. Uriel Smith and seconded by Br. J. Out that there be a special church meeting on Saturday next at 1 o'clock P.M. for the purpose of consulting concerning the future supply of the pulpit and transacting such other business as may be deemed necessary to the interest of Zion. The motion was carried unanimously.

Jan. 23, 1841

Met agreeable to appointment in special church meeting. Dea. U. Smith was then elected Chair.

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Prayer by Dea. Out. After which those brethren that had circulated subscription for Eld. Camp's support presented them. After some consultation & deliberation it was unanimous.

Resolved: That we give Eld. A. Camp a call to become our Pastor.

Resolved: That Deacon's U. Smith, J. Out be our committee to visit Eld. N. Camp and be instructed to offer to him \$375 and procure his wood for one year to commence his labors on the 1st of April next.

Resolved: That the Clerk present the above committee with a copy of the resolution touching the call of agreement with Eld. N. Camp.

Feb. 6, 1841

Monthly covenant meeting. Opened by prayer. Rec'd. by letter Br. Harry Rowland. Heard & accepted report of committee to visit Eld. Camp. They had attended to their duty & Eld. Camp accepted of Church's proposal to become their Pastor. Voted that the Clerk write a letter of admonition & citation to appear at next Covt. Meeting and show cause (if there be any) why we should not withdraw the hand of fellowship from each of the following members, S. S. Marsnus, J. Mason, Prudence Bonatts & Eliza Fuller.

Mar. 6, 1841

Covenant meeting. Those members that were cited to appear were not present. Voted letters of commendation & dismissal to Pastor John S. Dill, Polly Dill & Sarah Dill.

May 1, 1841

Covenant meeting. A good state of feeling. Rec'd. by letter Elder N. Camp & his wife Esther U. Camp. Br. Uriel Smith was appointed by vote to give the right hand of fellowship & performed the duty acceptably with an appropriate address. Voted a letter of dismissal & commendation to Sister M. Ashby.

Resolved: That Elder N. Camp be considered our Moderator while he remains with us.

Jun. 5, 1841

Monthly conference. Resolved that we overlook Br. Brink's sin and forgive him this time & restore him to our fellowship upon his confession.

Resolved: That we withdraw our fellowship from Br. Myron Miles for neglect of his covenant obligation, also from Br. Marcus P. Mason, sister Eliza Fuller and Prudence Bonatts for the same.

Resolved: That Br. D. Vail & K. Potter be a committee to visit Br. Elliott.

Sep. 4, 1841

Covenant meeting. Very good time.

Resolved: That we give letters of dismissal & commendation to Br. Jesse Carpenter & his wife Sister Sarah Carpenter & sisters Joanna Gambell & Frances Peters.

Resolved that we invite the semi annual meeting of the Assn. To hold their next session with us & send the invitation in our annual letter.

Resolved: That we represent ourselves in the coming Association by sending the following delegates and our annual epistle, S. S. Eld. N. Camp, Dea. Smith & P. Daniels with Br. C. Hoag, Perry Henderson &

Harry Rowland.

Sep. 26, 1841

Sabbath. Voted to restore Br. Wm. Reed to our fellowship upon his confession and grant him a letter of dismissal & commendation.

Oct. 2, 1841

Received: Br. P. Acker as candidate for baptism & membership after being baptized.

Resolved: That we receive the report of the committee appointed to visit Br. Elliott for delinquency in duty & for making too free use of the intoxication draught. Acknowledged he had been the worse for liquor. Requested him to appear at Covenant meeting but did not agree to do it. Signed Daniel Vail & Knight Potter as councilors.

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Resolved: That we build a wood house to the parsonage and enlarge the kitchen 7 feet.

Resolved: That Br. D. Vail, J. Out & R. Peters be a committee to superintend the building the wood house & enlarging the kitchen of the parsonage, also to raise the money to defray the expense of the same & for digging the well for the same parsonage by subscription & that Br. U. Smith & C. Hoag be associated with the above committee for the purpose of assisting them in their labors especially in the latter object.

Dec. 4, 1841

Only four or five present. Had a season of prayer & went our ways.

1842

Jan. 1, 1842

Covenant meeting. A good state of feeling at noon. Rec'd. Brunell K. Thompson by experience as a candidate for baptism. Baptized forthwith.

Jan. 4, 1842

Twenty sixth annual church meeting held pursuant to adjournment. Prayer by Eld. N. Camp. Proceeded to business. Made choice of Daniel Vail, Clerk for the ensuing year.

Heard the Deacons report and find in their hands \$3.15. Accepted & adopted unanimously.

Heard the Treasurers report and find in his hands \$2.10. Report accepted and adopted.

Resolved: That we elect the Deacons by joint ballot. Made choice of Uriel Smith, Josiah Daniels, John Out and E. V. P. French as Deacons. Made choice of S. S. Carpenter, Treasurer.

Voted that the Treasurer have charge of house & make fires and have \$3.00 for making fires. Made choice of Daniel Vail as Auditor.

Resolved: That we recommend for edification of the church that it be the duty of the Pastor with the Deacons & Elders to make a condensed report annually embracing the Spiritual Temporal State and Condition of the Church for the year past to expenses & incomes or decrease, together with all that may be thought proper and interesting to be embraced in said report. Adopted and accepted.

Whenever intemperance from the use of intoxicating drinks is too apparent to be denied by any, and the church of the Lord Jesus has been contaminated by it, wherefore resolved, as the professed disciples of Christ we will not use as a beverage any thing that intoxicates & will labour us Christians to do away the evil wherever it exists.

Made choice of Elder N. Camp, Deacons U. Smith & Br. Caleb Hoag & John Brown & Knight Potter as delegates to the semi annual meeting on the 3rd Tuesday in Jan. next.

Voted K. Potter, D. Vail committee to visit Br. A. Wadsworth.

Meeting adjourned to the 2nd Tuesday in Jan. 1843 at 10 A.M.

Feb. 5, 1842

Monthly meeting. Very bad traveling but few attended. Enjoyed a good degree of the Spirit.

Mar. 5, 1842

Covenant meeting. Bad traveling. Congregation small but an excellent Spirit professed. The Br. & Sisters, John Dakin, Betsey Dakin & Delia Millard received by experience. Baptized the 6th.

Mar. 13, 1842

Sunday Hannah White received by letter from LaFayette church, and chose Br. A. Palmer, J. Out, K. Patten, C. Hoag & Perry Henderson a committee to collect for N. Camp the past years candidates subscription for the year ensuing.

Apr. 2, 1842

Monthly meeting. A good time. Lamon Carr, Delaney Carr, J. Smith, Lucine Smith rec'd. as candidates for baptism. Took up the subject of Br. William Elliott. Withdrew hand of fellowship from him for neglect of church covenant and for immoral conduct. Br. U. Smith & J. Daniels a committee to

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visit Br. R. Carr. Sunday 3 baptized.

Apr. 30, 1842

Covenant meeting. A good season. About 70 Br's. & Sisters present. Br. Benjamin Buckingham dismissed by letter and Fran Van Wormer, Agnes Van Wormer his wife, Eliza Ann Warner, Mary Kivell led as candidates for baptism, Sabbath May 1st.

May 1, 1842

Communion. Largest number present there has been in 3 years.

May 21, 1842

Special church meeting. E. V. P. French, Clerk pro tem. Voted a committee of five to collect arrearages on subscription for E. Camp & circulate one for parsonage (Viz.) Br. H. Rowland, A. Palmer, S. S Carpenter, K. Patten & J. Hiscock - Committee appointed to visit R. Carr nephew.

Jun. 4, 1842

Covenant meeting. A good time after. Br. & Sis. spoke their minds. Voted to withdraw hand of fellowship from Br. Roswell Carr & his wife for neglect of church covenant & service. The country in a unchristian like manner. Appt. a committee to visit Br. Timothy Carr (viz) Deacon J. Daniels & Br. A. Palmer. Voted a letter of commendation to Br. & Sist. Camp.

Apr. 2, 1842

Covenant meeting. A good state of feeling after minds spoke, resolved to accept confession of Br. Timothy Carr, on his confession & exonerated the committee.

Jul. 3, 1842

Communion. Sister Olive Gilbert received by letter.

Aug. 6, 1842

Monthly meeting but few present. Took up the subject as contained in the 4th resolution of the Association of last year and put it over to next covenant meeting.

Sep. 3, 1842

Covenant meeting. A good degree of union pervaded the Br's. & Sis's. After hearing from them all, took up the subject postponed at last meeting and resolved to adopt the following preamble resolution:

Whereas we are taught by the Word of God not to lord it over God's heritage, but ye are brethren & one is your Master, even Christ, and as Baptists we have always held that the empire of conscience is too sacred to be crippled by Ecclesiastic Domination or invaded or polluted by worldly policy. And whereas we look upon American slavery to be an outrage upon the rights of man & a sin against God, Therefore resolved that so long as slavery exists in the Church we ought not only say we approve of the resolution but give slavery a rebuke at every corner & stand by the brothers who peacefully labor for it's overthrow.

Voted Elder N. Camp, Deacon U. Smith, J. Daniels, J. Out & brother L. L. Carpenter as delegates to the Association at Syracuse. Voted church meeting 17th Inst. 1 P.M.

Sep. 4, 1842

Communion. Sis. Deborah Van Wormer a letter of commendation. Joseph Benjamin & Betsey his wife rec'd. by letter. Elijah Adams & Martha his wife rec'd. by letter. Rec'd. Sis. Lauien Stokes, she having been baptized by a oration of her Christian experience.

Sep. 17, 1842

Church meeting. By appt. voted accept report & K. Potter & D. Vail a committee to visit Br. Wadsworth & discharge them. Resolved that we withdraw the hand of fellowship from him on account of various reports against him respecting his taking wagon springs unlawfully & neglecting to travel with the
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church & clear himself from reports when often requested by said committee. Voted to average expense of reframing parsonage on the members of the church, taking into consideration what each one has paid. Chose Joel Hiscock, E. V. P. French, Peter Henderson, D. Vail committee and the same be a committee to see Br. H. T. Tallman and find whether he means to pay any & if not report him to the church.

Oct. 1, 1842

Monthly meeting. After minds of Br. & Sist. Voted a letter of dismission to Russell Chase. Chose Br. U Smith & S. S. Carpenter as committee to audit accts. of Br. J. Out for expense on parsonage. Rev. Orin Palmer & Gruida his wife & Hepsibah Sweet as candidates for baptism.

Oct. 2, 1842

Baptized.

Nov. 5, 1842

Covenant meeting. A good degree of union prevailed. After minds spoken received Lydia Lee and Mary Lee. Received by letter and voted a letter of demission to Maria Winne.

Nov. 6, 1842

Dec. 3, 1842

Monthly meeting. After minds of Br. & Sist. took up subject put over from last covenant meeting of Br. Brown & wife. Voted a letter of dispensation to her & his case put off for Br. Laveat to write to him. Took up subject of Sist. Carr's exclusion. Put over to some future time.

Dec. 4, 1842

Voted a letter of dismission to Sist. Mary Kevill.

Dec. 31, 1842

Covenant meeting. Stormy day but few attended. Took up the subject of Sist. Carr which was put over at last meeting. Voted the Clerk write a letter to her.

1843

Jan. 1, 1843

Heard the Deacons report & find in their hands \$3.15. Accepted & adopted unanimously. Received the Treasurers report & find in his hands after paying for wood, cleaning house & cc. \$5.99. Accepted & adopted.

Resolved: That we choose three Deacons to remain permanently as such, made choice of Uriel Smith, Josiah Daniels & John Out as Deacons.

Made choice of S. S. Carpenter as Treasurer the ensuing year. Also to take charge of the house and be paid \$3.00 for making fires.

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Made choice of Daniel Vail as Auditor.

Heard report of church by its committee viz. N. Camp, Deacons & Clerk agreeable to a resolution at the last annual meeting. Accepted & adopted.
